



This can mean:


- (1) encouraging their initiatives,

Sometimes members want to tell us about issues they're experiencing and we're happy to listen.


Our board of directors is elected from our membership and by our membership to guide the direction of our organization.

We host a monthly Breakfast Speaker Series where a subject matter expert gives a talk on the issues on their current priority list, followed by an open discussion with chamber members.


This year, 2021 will mark the fourth and fifth time we will host a Small Business Week (due to COVID this year will see one in February and one in October).


WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU!


